What is the Home from Home Network?

A network that aims to allow families to gain control of the process with support from friends, families and professionals - create a genuine Home from Home.

Why is this network important?

Moving from the family home to independent living can be daunting, especially for individuals with learning disabilities and their parents and carers.

In partnership with Shared Lives Plus, we've spoken to carers and their families from across Wales about their anxieties of such an important period and we have collectively co-produced the Home from Home network to help families during this period.

Who will this network be for?

This network will be for family carers, Shared Lives Carers and professionals whose loved ones are -

- Thinking about transitioning from home to independent living
- Who have transitioned from home to live independently













- Who want to find out more about the transition and matching process and what options are available to them

This network is initially for mid-Wales, but we welcome families, friends and colleagues from all parts of Wales to contribute their support and experiences in the hope of

Through co-producing solutions with carers and partners, one of the things missing from the process at the moment is peer-support and the opportunity to take some time with professionals to discuss the emotional side and variety of options when transitioning from the family home to independent living.
